Overview

Y Services was commissioned by The Wave Project to find out what young people's views were on youth work delivery and support for young people on Hayling Island. This report details the results of a survey completed by 317 young people. The survey findings provide a narrative and context for the planning and development of possible youth work and support.



Survey Methodology




Some surveys were also undertaken with young people on the streets.

The survey results showed us that the 3 preferred platforms were:



Q2: How important is obtaining accreditation/certificate for the activities that you do?




We wanted to know how important accreditation was to young people.

The survey results showed us that a minority of young people 18% felt that accreditation was very important but 45% felt it was somewhat important.

Many youth work activities can be accredited towards an award scheme eg. Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

Q4: Do you think there are enough safe spaces on Hayling Island?




We wanted to know whether young people felt there were enough safe spaces on Hayling Island

The survey results showed us that the majority of young people 41% thought that there were enough safe spaces. Nearly 27% of those surveyed didn't know. This maybe because they were unaware of local facilities.


Q5: What does a safe space look like to you?

Q6: Issues affecting the young people on Hayling Island




We wanted to know which issues young people felt impacted on them.

The survey results show three main issues but isolation, cyber safety and caring responsibilities were significant issues for respondents,

Five young people who submitted free text responses identified homophobia as an issue.

Q7: Where do you currently get support from?




We wanted to know where young people currently got their support from.

The survey results show 77% of young people identified friends and family as key supporters.

12% identified school as a source of support.

Q8: Where would you prefer to speak to an outreach/youth worker?




We wanted to know young people's preference about where they would want to speak to an outreach / youth worker.

The survey indicates 24% wanted to meet an outreach / youth worker in their home. This maybe due to young people identifying the worker as a "support worker". It would be valuable to explore this issue further.

We wanted to know young people's views about the support they could access on Hayling Island


The survey results showed us that the majority of young people thought that support was ok, good or very good.

The majority of young people surveyed identified friends and family as their supporters.

Q10: When would you like to see youth clubs open in your area?




We wanted to know when young people wanted to see youth clubs delivered on Hayling Island.

The survey results showed no clear consensus on day or early / evening sessions.

Q11: What activities facilities and equipment would you like to see offered in our new youth hub?




We wanted to know what activities and facilities young people would like to see offered in a youth project on Hayling Island

The survey results again showed no clear consensus, but gaming, cooking and Gym equipment were the top 3 choices.


Q12: Which of the following do you currently access in your local area?




We wanted to know which spaces and facilities young people accessed on Hayling Island

Q13: How important do you think it is that young people have a voice in how services are delivered on Hayling Island?




Q14: Would you like to be involved in deciding which activities are funded on Hayling Island?


Q15: Do you think there are enough sport activities for young people on Hayling Island?



Q16: Do you think there are enough fitness facilities for young people on Hayling Island?





Q17: Do you think there are enough Wellbeing activities (e.g. mindfulness / Support with stress) for young people on Hayling Island?





Q18: Do you think there are enough Arts and media projects (e.g. music, design) for young people on Hayling Island?







Q20: Do you think there are enough Life skill (e.g. cooking, finance) projects for young people on Hayling Island?





Q24: Do you or your family pay for you to travel off Haying Island to clubs and activities?





Q25: If you go off the Island for activities. How much do you pay for travel a month?





Q26: How many times do you go off the island for activities per week?






Q28: Where do you live?


20 of those who submitted free text responses stated Hayling or South Hayling as the place that they lived.

Q29: Are you filling this survey in as a?





Q30: What age group do you belong to?







- DRUGS, BULLYING AND MENTAL HEALTH WERE IDENTIFIED AS THE 3 MAIN ISSUES FACING YOUNG PEOPLE ON HAYLING ISLAND
- 61% OF YOUNG PEOPLE SURVEYED STATED THAT THEY USED PARKS AS AN AMENITY. WITH LIBRARIES IDENTIFIED BY 14.57% AS A RESOURCE THAT THEY USED.

Key Findings

The purpose of this research was to see what young people's views on what support and facilities that they have and what they would like to see in the future.

This survey coincided with COVID, so circumstances prevented elements of the planned research. However from a sample of 317 young people identified some clear trends.

- YOUNG PEOPLE FELT THAT A SAFE SPACE SHOULD BE WELCOMING, WARM AND SOMEWHERE YOUNG PEOPLE COULD GET A HOT DRINK
- 77% OF YOUNG PEOPLE SURVEYED GOT SUPPORT FROM FRIENDS AND FAMILY
- 67% OF YOUNG PEOPLE SURVEYED FELT THAT IT WAS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT THAT YOUNG PEOPLE HAD A VOICE IN HOW SERVICES ARE DELIVERED ON HAYLING ISLAND

Conclusions & Next Steps

It was unfortunate that the COVID lockdown coincided within the timeframe of the survey as a smaller number of responses were able to be analysed than had been hoped for. However, what was evidenced in the responses with regards to youth work and youth workers falls into two potential areas

1. Requesting support at home rather than in other venues, could be linked to young people not fully understanding the role of a youth worker and the opportunities to meet in other venues. Young people may not be aware of the peripatetic nature of youth work
2. Young people had little or no experience of what a youth club offers. This may be due to the lack of youth clubs on the Island for a number of years. When the County Council had a youth work offer on Hayling Island it consisted of a youth centre, a full time youth worker and a large team of part time staff. At that time there was a range of youth work going on and young people understood what a youth work offer looked like.

Actions to support young people's understanding of the offer available to them by the Wave initiative could involve the following next steps:

A taster opportunity for young people within Hayling school and or other venues

Promotional video focussing on the WAVE Offer

Social media Campaign describing youth work and what a youth worker does



Conclusions & Next Steps

In planning youth work provision, organisations and adults fall into the trap of setting something up without asking or listening to young people.

With this survey the Wave project has set it's stall out and has the answers from young people. There is an exciting opportunity to deliver a youth work offer to young people on Hayling Island that is distinct and meets the needs of Hayling Young people.

Youth work does not just mean youth clubs and an offer on Hayling could look different and more flexible based on the of the research.
